The 2018 Grant Distribution was held on Tuesday, June 5th at the Presque Isle Park Pavilion. The community funds generated through a multitude of local donor gifts invested wisely over the last 30 years produced funds for Big Bay, Gwinn, Ishpeming, Negaunee and Marquette. Grants from a number of these funds were distributed for varied projects throughout Marquette County. 115 applications produced a total of 79 grants; 12 of which were funded by Negaunee!
