Community Response Fund

In March, the Community Foundation of Marquette County, in partnership with United Way of Marquette County, initiated the COVID-19 Community Response Fund in order to address issues related to the pandemic, and to provide support to local nonprofit organizations. The committee, consisting of various community leaders, meets frequently to review grant applications and distribute funds. Community needs will be addressed in three phases: immediate needs, intermediate support for nonprofits, and a final Community Response Endowed Fund, to help provide future funding to nonprofit organizations in a crisis. The Negaunee Area Community Fund granted \$3,500 to the

Community Response Fund efforts in the area. The fund has distributed over \$45,000 to date, providing grants for various programs, including: Feeding America, for Marquette County food pantries; Negaunee Senior Center, to provide 100 meals a week for six weeks to seniors at home; Big Brothers Big Sisters, to assist families with basic needs; and Great Lakes Recovery Center, to purchase personal protective equipment for staff and clients.
